Co-founder Casey Holley built the new, farmer-centered brewery and taproom out of a 10,000-square-foot building on the site of a former Minneapolis Public Schools headquarters, now the new [Highlight Center](#).

Able's [first brews](#) include the First Light American IPA, the House Red American pale ale, the "Blk Wlf" stout and the Two Sparrows wheat pale ale. Bobby Blasey, a graduate of the American Brewers Guild and former head brewer at Mankato Brewery, is handling the brewing.

Able, located near Broadway & Central, has an approximately 200-seat taproom adjacent to its brewing and malting operations.

The brewery at 1121 Quincy St. NE is open 3-11 p.m. on Wednesday and Thursday, 1-11 p.m. on Friday, 12-11 p.m. on Saturday and 12-6 p.m. on Sunday. Able is closed on Monday and Tuesday.



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
